Know that lots of people usually live in cities because: - There are lots of jobs - There are lots of fun things to do (theatre / sport and music venues) and that this is known as 'entertainment'. - They want to be near family who might live in the city - They want to be near good transport links (train stations / airports / motorways) so that they can to other places in the country or the world more easily. To know that every country has a 'capital city' which is usually their biggest in population. In the UK, these are: - England: London - Scotland: Edinburgh - Northern Ireland: Belfast - Wales: Cardiff To know that in the UK there are lots of other cities, which include: - Manchester - London - Edinburgh - Bristol - Belfast - Belfast - Birmingham - Cardiff - Liverpool To know that North, South, East and West are directions on a map which refer to 'the top' 'the bottom', 'the right' and 'the left of a map'. To know that the United Kingdom is divided into 11 regions and that many of these regions can use North, South, East and West to describe where they are. To know that Luton is in the East of England 			

 To know that Luton is a large town. To know that Luton shares similarities with cities: It is a place where there are lots of opportunities to get a job (airport / town centre / hospitals / schools / shops / taxis It is a place where there are lots of opportunities to engage in entertainment (football stadium / cinema / shops) It has many people here who moved to Luton from other countries to be near family. To know that we can find places on a map using 4 figure referencing. To know that 4 figure-referencing will use a horizontal value first and a vertical value second. To know that the first figure will be a letter which the city is in (London = F). To know that the second figure will be a number which the city is in (London = F). To know that the other two digits are made up of estimates in the box of where London is (London = F9 28)
