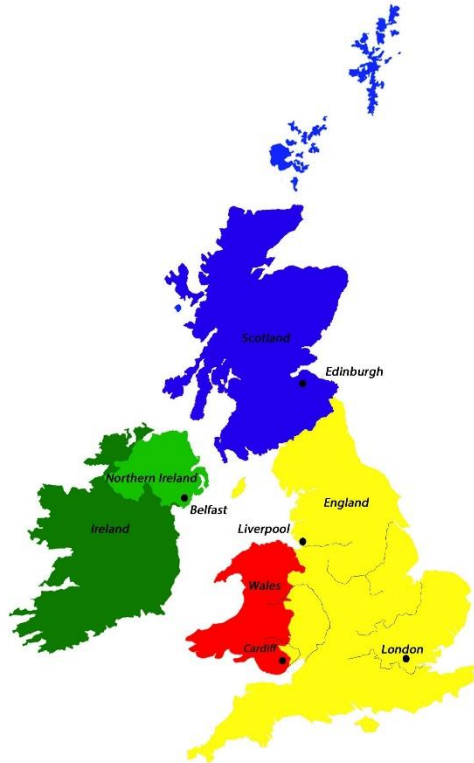

Key Vocabulary		Important Facts	
<p>Urban: A word related to a town or a city</p> <p>Settlement: A place where people once did not live, but now do</p> <p>Capital City: The city in the country where the government rules from</p> <p>Population: The number of people who live / are in a place</p> <p>Entertainment: Fun things to do which people enjoy</p> <p>Transport: The manner in which people move around (and out of) the country e.g. car, bike, train, aeroplane, boat</p> <p>North: a direction, one in which a compass will point</p> <p>East: 90 degrees clockwise from North</p> <p>South: 180 degrees clockwise from North</p> <p>West: 270 degrees clockwise from North</p> <p>Region: An area of a country with its own characteristics</p> <p>Town: A built-up area with a name, defined boundaries, and local government, that is larger than a village and generally smaller than a city</p> <p>Luton: The town in which most of the children live in, which the school is located in.</p> <p>4-figure-referencing: A way of showing where something is on a map. This will contain a vertical and a horizontal value</p> <p>Horizontal: A positional direction from left to right or right to left</p> <p>Vertical: A positional direction from up to down or down to up</p>		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Know that a city is a large urban settlement, usually with a large population. • Know that lots of people usually live in cities because: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - There are lots of jobs - There are lots of fun things to do (theatre / sport and music venues) and that this is known as 'entertainment'. - They want to be near family who might live in the city - They want to be near good transport links (train stations / airports / motorways) so that they can to other places in the country or the world more easily. • To know that every country has a 'capital city' which is usually their biggest in population. In the UK, these are: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - England: London - Scotland: Edinburgh - Northern Ireland: Belfast - Wales: Cardiff • To know that in the UK there are lots of other cities, which include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Manchester - Edinburgh - Belfast - Cardiff - London - Bristol - Birmingham - Liverpool • To know that North, South, East and West are directions on a map which refer to 'the top' 'the bottom', 'the right' and 'the left of a map'. • To know that the United Kingdom is divided into 11 regions and that many of these regions can use North, South, East and West to describe where they are. • To know that Luton is in the East of England 	

- To know that **Luton** is a large **town**.
- To know that **Luton** shares similarities with cities:
 - It is a place where there are lots of opportunities to get a job (airport / town centre / hospitals / schools / shops / taxis)
 - It is a place where there are lots of opportunities to engage in entertainment (football stadium / cinema / shops)
 - It has many people here who moved to Luton from other countries to be near family.
- To know that we can find places on a map using **4 figure referencing**.
- To know that **4 figure-referencing** will use a **horizontal** value first and a **vertical** value second. To know that the first figure will be a letter which the city is in (London = F). To know that the second figure will be a number which the city is in (London = F 2). To know that the other two digits are made up of estimates in the box of where London is (London = F9 28)

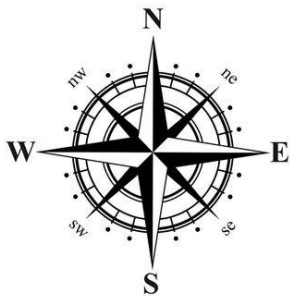
UK Map with Capital Cities
